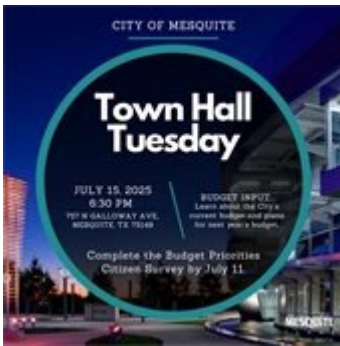
### Independence Day information
