Officer Paul Wathen began his career with the Mesquite Police Department in 2012 as a police officer. He had previous law enforcement experience as an officer in South Dakota. In seven short years, Officer Wathen's work ethic has placed him as the department's leading arresting officer for DWI and DWI related offenses and his supervisors consider him the driving force behind many procedural improvements in the DWI program. Paul's passion for DWI enforcement shows through and influences others in a way that has a positive impact on the Department. Officer Wathen also participated as a Field Training Officer sharing valuable information while training new recruits before they are released on their own. Officer Wathen has also been recognized through his training as a Drug Recognition Expert.

Officer Wathen holds a Master Peace Officer Certification and Basic Instructor Certification from the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. Officer Wathen is skilled as an Instructor teaching DWI topics and certifying new Field Training Officers. Officer Wathen was involved in a critical incident last year in which his actions likely saved the life of a fellow officer.
