City announces sales tax activity for November 2021

The January sales tax receipts, which represent sales activity for the month of November, for the City of Mesquite, were 26% above the amount reported for the same period last year. The increase in sales tax activity this period is driven primarily by general retail sales along with building and home furnishings, wholesale trade and manufacturing. Sales tax contributes 25% of the total revenue used to support the General Fund. The City uses the General Fund for services including police, fire, parks and recreation, libraries, neighborhood services and public works.
