## September Sales Tax



The City of Mesquite September sales tax receipts, which represent sales activity for the month of July, was 7.9 percent above the amount reported for the same period last year. The current increase in sales activity is driven by wholesale trade, manufacturing, utilities, home furnishings and improvements. Sales tax contributes 28 percent of the total revenue used to support the General Fund. The City uses the General Fund for services

including police, fire, parks and recreation, libraries, neighborhood services and public works.
