Mesquite Metro Airport ranked in top 25 percent busiest airports with FAA Contract Towers in America

The Mesquite Metro Airport was recently ranked in the top 25 percent of the busiest airports with Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Contract Towers in America. The public use airport averages 217 take-offs and landings per day which is an 11.3 percent increase in operations from last year. The airport features one of only 23 control towers in Texas staffed by FAA contractual air traffic controllers for safe air travel. The airport also provides several community-based services and programs including police and fire support, medical flights, wildfire patrols, and Civil Air Patrol search and rescue.
