Residents encouraged to use the 4 D's of mosquito defense

Prevention is the best defense against West Nile and other mosquito-borne viruses. Remember the four D's when enjoying the outdoors this summer: 1) Dusk and dawn are the times of day when infected mosquitoes are the most active and when you should try to stay indoors; 2) Dress in long sleeves and pants when outside; 3) Use insect repellents with DEET as an active ingredient; 4) Drain
